All you need is to be a Al-Anon member attending meetings regularly for two years and a criminal record check plus read the guidelines and get in touch with me your Area Alateen Coordinator .

I would love to tell you more about this service opportunity and give you all the information so please feel free to send me an email.

The Alateen recertification Window Opened January 13, 2021!

Every year, each Area in the World Service Conference Structure is required to take part in the Annual Alateen Recertification process in order to continue to use the Alateen name.

This is explained in the 2003 Alateen Motion from the Board of Trustees and the policy for Alateen. Both are found beginning on page 93 of the 2018-2021 Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual (P-24/27), version two (2)._

The recertification process is two-fold:

- 1. To verify that every registered Alateen group has current certified Al-Anon Members Involved in Alateen Service (AMIAS):
 - as Group Sponsor(s)
 - as the Current Mailing Address (CMA) to the Alateen group as a Phone Contact for the Public for the Alateen group
- 2. To verify the current certification of all AMIAS we are requesting that all Areas complete the Alateen recertification by **June 15, 2021!**

This allows the WSO to verify that the Area recertification is complete by June 30.

Contact your Area Alateen Coordinator, Area Alateen Process Person, or District Representative to verify the process in your Area. Don't miss out on this opportunity to share your recovery with teens and younger members!

Hello readers,

This month I am reviewing <u>In All our Affairs: Making Crisis Work for You</u> 255 pages (B-15). This is a great resource from Al-Anon for anyone in the program. There are four parts to the book: Awareness, Acceptance, Action and Moving On.

This book reminds me that, with the help of Al-Anon, I can live through any crisis and come out the other side. The stories cover a wide range of challenges including molestation, job loss, infidelity, imprisonment, death of a loved one and bankruptcy, among others. I am reminded that alcoholism is a disease and that it affects the entire family. I learn through the readings that I am powerless over this disease, but the God of my understanding is not powerless. I learn that to heal, I need to take the focus off the alcoholic and put it in on me and my life choices. I can get out of denial and become familiar with my likes and dislikes. I can become more grateful and able to let go of regret and guilt. With the loving support of other Al-Anon members, I can find serenity and can become able to accept "life on life's terms".

In this book I read how easy it can be to live in a fantasy world as a way of coping. Slowly the people in the stories learned to come out of denial, something that can be as gradual as it needs to be, since Al-Anon is a gentle program. I also learn that the other people in my life can recover when they are ready. Nonetheless, even if they do not change, I can still be happy.

I am reminded in this book that it is important to keep talking to others, both within and outside of the meetings. With the help of these meetings and the other tools of the program I can find a Higher Power. Also, this concept of a Higher Power can change over time. This book covers the experiences of both newcomers to the program as well as longer-term members.

The book ends with a list of the Twelve Steps, the Twelve Traditions, the Twelve Concepts of Service, and the General Warranties of the Conference. The book is indexed for easy reference. As always, find this book at your local depot or at Al-Anon.org.

Search for A Canada West Trustee

The Nominating Committee is inviting the Areas with the Canada West Region to submit an applicant for a Canada West Regional Trustee to serve a one-year appointment on the Board of Trustees. The term will begin following the Annual Board Meeting in April 2021. Resumes must be submitted to the World Service Office by February 12, 2021.

The applicant being submitted is required to go through an Area approval process following which the **applicant resume will be submitted by the Area Delegate.** Taking into consideration the short deadline for resume submission, the Area approval process is left up to Area autonomy.

Please note the requirement regarding length of continuous Al-Anon membership. Trustee applicants do not need to have served as a Delegate! For those that have, they must wait until two World Service Conferences have passed after their terms end before they can be considered. This year the Board has approved a World Service Office Al-Anon Members in Alateen Service (AMIAS) Certification Program which includes successful completion by applicants of a national background check.

Thanks for your effort in helping us find a candidate for the Board of Trustees, and for your service to the families and friends of alcoholics!

Al-Anon Central Services is restarting its search for a paid Office Manager. Cynthia filled the position when it became vacant as an acting Office Manager. She continued while we were in the process of relocating to a permanent office location; it has been approximately one year. The new office is brilliant - a South facing window - and the new systems for the office functions are brilliant too!

I am not going to go into details at this early calling but will generally say it is a low paying paid - position, \$15.50 per hour and at the moment three hours, three days a week. We learned from our experience when we interviewed applicants a year ago, to be up front that this is a position for someone possibly retired, or someone needing experience to get back into the work force, it is a very part time position. That being said it could change into more hours as it was before the pandemic. Any person interested needs to know you must be an active member of Al-Anon for at least two years, meaning you attend meetings regularly and plan to continue to do so and also have a firm grasp of the Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions.

The Office Manager is not alone, there is plenty of space for volunteers as there were before our unique health situation changed all that. Also we have a Committee with a Chair, Secretary, Treasurer and Member at Large and some 60 members of the Society. As with all Al-Anon activity you can be greatly emotionally and spiritually rewarded.

Reflection. I was a volunteer in the community and the Institution I volunteered for told me I had a "calling" and encouraged me to go to college and qualify to work in the field and I did. I am so grateful for their vision of how I could use my skills to benefit my community and my personal growth. Perhaps you; have an inkling the Office Manager position may be of interest to you, give the office a call and have a chat.

Ask it Basket

Question: Several members have been making personal donations to WSO in lieu of Tradition Seven donations at the group level. One member makes a monthly donation as an automatic payment from her bank account. In the past she has received a tax receipt twice a year. This year she did not receive one in July and wondered if the procedure has changed.

Others are making donations online through the contribution section at the WSO website using their credit card or PayPal. Will they receive a tax receipt at year end?

I notice that the website indicates a tax receipt will be issued for a recurring bank draft but does not indicate if this also applies to donations by credit card or PayPal. Could you clarify the process?

Answer from WSO, Director of Finance, Niketa Williams (January 12, 2021): Contributions made via PayPal in the US/Canada will not receive an additional tax receipt. The receipt from PayPal is their tax record. All other individual contributions will receive a tax receipt. We are mailing out US tax contributions acknowledgements this week. Canadian acknowledgments will be mailed next week.

How to Stay Connected

The other day I was talking to some AI-Anon members and it came up about the way they connect to meetings.

Some members find it necessary to use their vehicle as a private place to attend a zoom meeting. Times have changed when members could make an excuse like going to the library and then slip into a meeting. Finding a private place when face to face meetings are cancelled can be a challenge. However, for "freedom from despair" they are willing to bundle up and suffer some inconvenience to listen and share for the betterment of their spiritual and emotional growth.



Campfire Meetings - These are outdoors, bring your own chair, someone brings a propane "campfire", bring your own literature, coffee, dress for the weather, perhaps they are in a covered picnic area in a park with room for social distancing, designated time and place, and a bonus to fellowshipping lots of fresh air. I know of two of these meetings, Al-Anoners can be persistent and innovative. Some of these folks do not use technology.

One member that could not use technology and could not attend the face-toface meetings, found his/her phoning members less and less fulfilling and expressed this concern to me. I realized on my phone I could merge calls and set up a time and a day with two others and we are now "conference calling", the four of us. We use the topic from the meeting list. For three of us the topic is our second time round and so we can expand and express perhaps some



new perspectives we learned at the zoom meeting the previous night. This is a temporary way of connecting – only temporary. I have faith that safe face to face meetings will return in the near future.

You know the saying "where there is a will there is a way" but sometimes God's will be our Higher Power nudging us to take the lead by initiating solutions to problems for others which gives members an opportunity to choose a new way of fellowship.
