Breaking News!

She is excited to represent her group at the BC/Yukon Area Assembly September 22, 23 & 24 in Walnut Grove, Langley.

Her group has funds set aside and taken a group conscience

for her to book a hotel room and to reimburse her for travel expenses to Assembly and her meals. She has already booked her room and messaged a fellow Group Representative she met last year to be her roommate and share the costs.

Ermagarde attended in person last year and had an amazing experience of Al-Anon fellowship and learnt many things to support her in her role as Group Representative in "*Carrying the envelope*" for her group.

She is very motivated in doing her preparation work, everything she needs is on the website under Assembly 2023 section.

Ermagarde has reached out to her Service Sponsor, Matilda, for help in reviewing some of the documents on the thought force recommendations and Consent Agenda items such as reviewing the Assembly 2022 minutes and the Officers & Coordinators reports.

The Group Representative Guide to Assembly has answered many questions for Ermagarde. Ermagarde created a Group Representative Binder of organized group information and resources that she learned about at Assembly last year and personalized it to her Groups' specific information. She plans to take that to Assembly with her Service Manual version 2 - 2022-2025 (available now at your local LDC.)

Public Outreach

What a perfect time to talk about service. September is our Assembly and Group Representatives will be voting on members to fill service positions.

My position with Public Outreach will be open and it is very important that it is filled as it is the connection we have with the members and the public letting them know who we are and what we do. This helps our numbers grow. We attract rather than promote, but we can only do that by reaching out to professionals, the public, and institutions. As one member says, "boots on the ground."

Public Outreach has a committee that is approximately 5-8 Al-Anon members, and they meet monthly to discuss ways to attract people to advise their clients, patients and start new groups in institutions as well as invite family and friends to our established meetings.

Service in Al-Anon allows us to stretch ourselves to practice the Al-Anon principles while we connect with others with whom we can be ourselves. It is an opportunity to attempt something we can achieve and to gain self-esteem by doing something of value.

Being in service is also an opportunity to become familiar with the 12 Concepts. For instance, Concept Four is *"Participation is the key to Harmony."* Having lived with an active alcoholic for many years, I felt isolated and lonely. My sponsor encouraged me to do service work and when I did, I found a brand-new aspect to my recovery in Al-Anon. I found something bigger than myself and learned how to be with others again and it gave me the ability to practice the 12 Traditions which I had not incorporated into my recovery.

The Three Legacies, Steps, Traditions, and Concepts are an integral part of my recovery and by doing service, I no longer feel alone but active with like-minded people. I am very grateful to be of service in this wonderful program which gives me a focus and a purpose, and I am committed to service in any capacity.
