Area Chair's Report

Happy New Year!!

I hope you all had a peaceful and happy Christmas/Holiday season and are ready to take on 2022 and whatever it brings to us! I am ready for a New Year that is better and more connected than the last two have been.

The World Service Conference theme for 2022 is "Enhancing Our Recovery Through Abundance, Unity and Understanding." For the BC Yukon Area, I would love to see an Abundance of service volunteers, which will contribute to the continued Unity within our membership and a better Understanding of our program and of each other as we strive to recover from the effects of alcoholism and help each other in that journey of recovery.

This is my third and last year as your Chair. I am so looking forward to being able to meet in person, this year, with as many of you as possible. Since we will be having hybrid meetings, I know I will be able to have more face-to-face contact. As there is still uncertainty out there, I understand and respect that not everyone will be comfortable with the in-person contact. It will be a learning curve and new experience to have our Area World Service Committee Meetings and Assemblies as hybrid, but I know we are up to the task.

The Area World Service Committee Meeting will be held **May 27-29**, **2022**. We currently do not have a host location, but I have been in contact with all the District Representatives in the Area and have requested that they contact their Groups to see if they can summon up some interest to host this event in their District. I hope to be able to announce the location in the next Bulletin, which means I need to know by the end of January. Hosting this event, in my experience, has been a wonderful way to boost morale within a District and help

groups get to know each other better and do some bonding while having fun!!

Our Assembly is normally held the fourth weekend of September in Langley. Due to a booking issue with the Church Hall that we use, we were unable to secure our usual dates. This year we will be meeting a week later, on **September 30**th- **October 2**nd. Letting you all know way in advance for planning purposes. This happened another time a few years ago and we managed fine even though I know the extra week can make a difference for vehicle travel. There are other options for travel such as busing, carpooling, air, or Zoom!!

This year one of the focus items will be Transforming Permanent Electronic meetings to Al-Anon Family Groups. We will be hearing from the Thought Force that is currently meeting regularly and working hard on our behalf to bring some ideas for us to consider. Our task is to decide whether our Area will accept permanent electronic groups that may want to join our geographic Area and if so, what that will entail. It is a big topic and is going to require much thought and discussion and I look forward to hearing from the members of the Thought Force.

The Officers, Coordinators and Liaisons will be meeting at the end of January to establish the Agenda for the Area World Service Committee Meeting and you will be receiving that hopefully in the March Bulletin.

We are still in need of members willing to serve in the following service opportunities:

Group Records Coordinator, Alateen Coordinator, Hybrid Meeting Equipment Coordinator, Archives Coordinator (last 2 years of term), Treasurer (last 2 years of term).

It is difficult to see how our Area can function effectively without our slate of service volunteers. I am including a contribution from a member in the Forum that talks about Rotation of Leadership and the learning opportunities that await us in doing service. I hope it strikes a chord and prompts you to step out of your comfort zone and into a new experience that will no doubt bring you more recovery and Joy in Service!

Embracing New Opportunities to Serve

When I think of the many service roles, I was encouraged to stand for during my volunteer years, I am reminded of this quote from *When I Got Busy, I Got Better* (P-78): "I am not encouraged to identify myself with any of the roles I try on, and I am encouraged to pass the job on after a fairly

definite period of time. Al-Anon calls this arrangement 'rotation of leadership,' and I find in this concept the encouragement to participate without exerting control and to let go without worrying that others might not step forward to carry on" (p. 50). This idea helped me to identify and accept my service roles and opportunities in Al-Anon—and to pass them along when the time came.

As a previous Sponsor once told me, new experiences, should we accept them, come into our lives to teach us something about ourselves. I have learned that my willingness to accept a new experience when presented gives me the courage to release control of the outcome. After all, I am reminded, I took on a service role or job that someone before me decided to let go. So, it may be time for me to do the same in order to experience a new opportunity that has been placed before me.

As we come to the end of this year, hopefully many Areas have had members step forward to fill vacant positions and embark upon exciting new opportunities in service. Here at the World Service Office, we are excited that members have applied for and accepted positions that will help our continuing efforts to disseminate current information to those seeking our support.

I am grateful that we in our fellowship practice rotation of leadership. And because of this practice, we have learned, or are learning, that embracing new service opportunities—as well as passing them on to the next trusted servant—ultimately supports those seeking our Al-Anon message of hope.


Literature Coordinator

Hello and welcome to the January 2022 edition of the Bulletin.

I am excited about the possibility of introducing you, the members of BC Yukon, to more Conference Approved Literature during this upcoming year.

Recently, I have become a huge enthusiast of WSO pamphlets. These short publications have provided countless topics for group meetings and an inexpensive means to introduce newcomers to the tools of recovery through Al-Anon.

One such pamphlet is P-15 **Three Views of Al-Anon** where alcoholics speak to the families. The first view of Al-Anon is provided by Bill W, cofounder of AA. Bill acknowledges the rapid growth and effect of Al-Anon and its impact on the family disease of alcoholism.



The second view is an open letter from an alcoholic to those family members who are most affected by the alcoholics drinking, lack of responsibility, empty promises, and manipulation. This is his appeal "to learn all you can about alcoholism and your role in relation to me."

The third view advises the recovering alcoholic to include 12th Step work to the family.

This short publication clearly connects the dots between the alcoholic and the family and how the most effective way to deal with an alcoholic in the family is to seek help for themselves. "By getting distance and perspective, the family

regains a bit of sanity. By practicing the Twelve Steps themselves, they begin to regain a life worth living. Light, peace and serenity appear where there had been nothing but agonizing doubt, fear, anger and guilt."

Most groups provide a collection of Conference Approved Literature to be used during meetings. Covid has sent many groups onto the Zoom platform and those books remain in locked cupboards and inaccessible to the group members. Pamphlets are economical and are readily available through the Literature Distributions Centers.

Past Literature Coordinator

Over the years many wonderful volunteers have served as Literature Coordinator to the BC Yukon area. I would like to mention one of those volunteers who has been instrumental in my recovery and a huge part of my willingness to serve. Eve M. has been a mentor to me personally and to many, many others in the program. Eve M. served as Literature Coordinator during 2002, 2003 and part of 2004. Dear Long timers in Al-Anon,

We older members of Al-Anon play a very important role in our groups. By our attitudes and general bearing, we can prove to the new members that Al-Anon really works. What we are affects the group for good or bad much more than what we say. Whether we like it or not, newcomers will judge Al-Anon by what it has done for us.

If we have achieved even a degree of serenity, tolerance, and understanding, newer members will aim to acquire these qualities also.

On the other hand, if we try to dominate and do not give the newer members a chance to develop, we are stunting our groups and keeping newcomers away.

From a place on the sidelines, Oldtimers can give the group purpose and continuity, but not management—unless asked to fill a special function. We are always willing to help where we can, but the active leadership of the group should be in newer hands. Our passive but inspirational leadership is much more important than the active direction of a group.

If at one time we held the active leadership of our group, it may be particularly hard to "let go." It is so easy to believe that because we have been in Al-Anon for years, we must be qualified to tell others what to do, but our "actions speak louder than words."

When taking an inventory, we long timers need to constantly remind ourselves of this point and ask ourselves if for some personal reason (thoughtlessness, egotism, a desire to dominate) we are still telling others what to do and how to do it.

I have to learn this lesson myself and want to pass it on to all you other long timers.
