One of the common topics of many editions of the Bulletin is service. In my service role as your Area Assembly Chair, I have been presented with many

types of challenges and I hesitate to call them "challenges". I like to think I have been presented with opportunities for me to strengthen my recovery from the family disease of alcoholism. Some of my growth opportunities have been logistical – Wi-Fi, travel, email systems, etc. While other opportunities have been more unexpected – relationships, work/life balance, acceptance, and communication.

My logistical opportunities for growth have included – Wi-Fi connectivity, website maintenance support, and email server issues. I am so grateful for the principles of Al-Anon. The slogans "I'm never alone", "together, we can", and "first things first" have been at the forefront of my mine as I carry out Area service work. "Reasoning things out with someone else" has also grown in importance. When I stray or loose sight of the next right thing to do, I turn to my Higher Power, the Steps, Traditions, Concepts, and my fellow Area servants to lovingly guide me. Experiencing Al-Anon is all about learning to have healthy relationships. Prior to Al-Anon I struggled to determine what was my responsibility and what was the responsibility of others. I reacted, used survival coping skills, and often ran myself ragged spiritually, physically, and emotionally trying to do for others what they could do for themselves. Those survival coping behaviours do not serve me well. I have learned to reach out to trusted Al-Anon Area servants, Al-Anon friends, and my sponsor when I am not sure about my responsibilities. I am accountable for my actions, and not the actions (or inaction) of others. I also have learned more about humility. Because of Al-Anon, I have a clearer sense of what my strengths are and what character traits I need to work on or let go of.

I'll sum up by wishing all members the courage and strength to take advantage of the recovery that the experience of Al-Anon service allows. Whether it be at the group level, the district level, Area level, one-to-one through sponsorship, or otherwise, **service IS recovery**.

I risked "not doing it right" as if someone were judging me and felt more accepting of myself when members told me how they related to parts of my story that were theirs too. We need starters, members that have not shared before, to be a speaker at an Anniversary Meeting a good way to get started. Also, members to speak at Round Ups. Start thinking of your story; what it was like, what happened and what it is like now, it is as simple as that. Please give **the Central Office a call to sign up, take a risk, we need recovery stories** to reinforce we are not alone.
