own for dinner.



Hello Everyone,

Ermagarde is busy reviewing the Agenda for her upcoming District meeting where they will be discussing accommodating PEGs (Permanent Electronic Groups) in her geographical District. They are considering the following questions: Do they have strong enough WiFi where they meet? Does the District have the equipment to include Hybrid meetings?

Alternatively, should they require the Group Representative or Alternate Group Representative from the PEG to attend the District meeting in person? Prior to the District meeting, the members were asked to review the "The Area PEG Task Force Guidelines" that Group Representatives accepted at Assembly.

Ermagarde looked up the PEG Task Force recommendations including the structures, policies, and procedures on the BC/Yukon website under the Member Resources/2022 Assembly Documents/TaskThought Force Reports and Discussion Topics/Electronic Meetings Task Force Report headings and then she found the following link: (copy and paste into your browser) https://al-anon.org/for-members/group-resources/group-records/new-electronic-meeting-registration/. While researching the recommendations, Ermagarde found the following important instructions that helped her to register her new PEG in the BC/Yukon Area.

Suggested Process to Register PEG With BC/Yukon Area:

- Click the Electronic PEG Registration link to change from a face-to-face meeting to a permanent electronic group or to register a new electronic group: https://al-anon.org/for-members/group-resources/group-records/new-electronic-meeting-registration/
- 2. Follow the instructions to complete the electronic form.

You can also print a paper application, complete, scan, and email, <u>but electronic registration is preferred</u> by the WSO staff and our Group Records Coordinator.

Requesting assignment to a geographical District (rather than the electronic district #34): Once the PEG is registered with BC/Yukon, the group can request assignment to a geographical

District. The District will need to agree to accept the PEG. Districts will have the autonomy to decide if their District meetings will have an electronic option or if Group Representatives will be expected to attend in person. The PEG will need to agree to participate according to the District's practices.

Ermagarde clicked the link to the new Al-Anon Group Registration and completed it with her new PEG information.

Treasurer

Hello to my Al-Anon friends,

Thank you to the many groups that have been able to contribute to BC/Yukon Area in the past few months. With the recent increase in contributions, our Area finances are comfortably able to cover expenses and we have \$10,000 in our 'prudent reserve'. The Area's prudent reserve requirement is larger than what groups or districts may need. BC/Yukon has 2 GICs of \$5,000 each to ensure we can pay expenses to host AWSCM and Assembly should contributions fall sharply, or expenses rise significantly. This amount is approximately one third of our annual budget.

I have received a few questions about guidelines for 'prudent reserves' at the group and district levels of service. For reference, I read the Al-Anon Guideline G-41 that helps us understand how the experiences of thousands of members have helped define what works for many groups, districts, and areas. You can find this guideline using this path: https://al-anon.org/for-members/members-resources/manuals-and-guidelines/guidelines/ Guideline G-41, "Reserve Fund" is listed at the bottom of the page. Feel free to explore some of the other guidelines that may be useful to your group or district members.

The Reserve Fund Guideline was created to answer questions World Service Office receives from members. Although the guideline addresses Area, District and Group reserve funds, today I will focus on Group Reserve Funds. This information can apply to all groups, including the newly formed permanent electronic groups (PEG).

The purpose of a reserve fund is to ensure that group rent, and other expenses can be met in the event membership contributions decline or expenses increase unexpectedly. Typically, voluntary contributions by members should be sufficient to cover group expenses with some left over to build a reserve fund. How much should this reserve fund hold? Most groups will maintain a reserved amount to cover 1 to 4 months fixed expenses. Many groups distribute funds quarterly to district, local AIS office, Area and WSO. Using excess group funds for special projects such as public outreach is encouraged. If groups choose not to have a reserve fund, members can contribute additional amounts to meet expenses as needed.

This guideline has questions on page 2 for groups to consider when making decisions about a group reserve fund. These can guide your group to making informed decisions. On page 3 of this guideline are some questions to use for a 'Group Financial Inventory'. Page 4 has a brief outline of how your group may create a group budget.

I encourage you to use this guide to have group discussions about finances. As with all Al-Anon guidance, the Traditions and Concepts lead the way. Tradition 4: "Each Group should be autonomous, except in matters affecting another group or Al-Anon or AA as a whole" and Concept 12 Warranty 1: "that only sufficient operating funds, including an ample reserve, be its prudent financial principle."
