Dear Al-Anon/Alateen Family,

My patience is being tested, but I am reminded that "This Too Shall Pass"! I am feeling optimistic though because World Service Conference is growing closer and preparations are ramping up.

Meeting with my Mentee

One of the privileges of being a third-year Delegate is being assigned a mentee, a first-year Delegate. I was assigned Matt W. from Wilmington, Delaware. I was quite surprised that my assigned mentee is a male; but when we met via Zoom, I learned that there are more male first-year Delegates than male third-year Delegates, so it is encouraging to know that male membership in Al-Anon is growing! During our chat we shared about our Al-Anon service experience, what Conferences have been like for me, some strategies that helped to keep me organized and focused, and generally how to be prepared, comfortable and confident, not only before Conference, but also during Conference Week. We plan to meet again.

Chosen Agenda Item

I was gratified to receive a suggestion for a Chosen Agenda Item from one of our long-time members, Sally E., to submit for consideration at World Service Conference. Here it is: CAI TOPIC: The God of Our Understanding Should No Longer Be Masculine. WHY IS THIS CAI IMPORTANT: Over time, Al-Anon has evolved away from its original overt references to Christianity. It is not a religious program but a spiritual one. This language change continues to attract members otherwise averse to religion. Yet we continue to recite antiquated references to a male god. The God of Our Understanding needs to be the gender of our choosing. It's time to replace He/Him/His with more inclusive, gender-neutral pronouns – they/them/their - now widely

accepted in our society. Even though this subject has been discussed at previous World Service Conferences, I believe that perhaps the time is right to present it for discussion again. Conference members will select topics to be discussed during Conference week, so I will keep you posted and will include results in my Delegate's report.

Important Al-Anon Dates to Celebrate:

March 4, 1891 – Birthdate of Lois W. When I think of this remarkable woman and AI-Anon cofounder Anne B. along with the other AI-Anon pioneers, I am filled with gratitude for their perseverance, vision and spirituality in laying the foundation for the AI-Anon program. I am in the process of re-reading the memoirs of Lois in *Lois Remembers* and reflecting on not only her remarkable life but also the legacy she left for us. 

Central Services Committee

This month Central Services Offices decided to explore the actions of service by way of an interview with Cynthia Y. our **acting** Office Manager. This is meant to inspire members to be curious and explore an opportunity to expand their service experience.

The opportunity is the paid position of a part-time Office Manager and we are now looking for applications. Please see February's Bulletin where you will find initial information about the position. Al-Anon considers that all members are service members by attending meetings, but other service opportunities open up to members in the program to well I will let Cynthia tell you about her service experience.

I am posing questions and Cynthia is answering:

1. What value do you place on your service work in Al-Anon?

Cynthia: I consider service work to be very valuable in my recovery and in my ability to give back to the program that has changed my life. My first service "position" was helping to set up and take down the chairs at my home group. That small request from our Group Representative gave me a reason to keep coming back each week and helped me to feel part of the group. For a good part of my life, I always felt apart from but being in service not only helped me be a part of it helped me to feel needed and appreciated.

2. What have you gained over time by engaging in volunteering for service work?

Cynthia: I have gained so much from each service position I have ever held: self-confidence, new skills, new friends, feelings of inclusion, knowledge that I am never alone, the ability to laugh at myself, experiencing more recovery with each task and last, but certainly not least----fun.

3. How does unconditional love express itself in service?

Cynthia: Unconditional love is defined as giving something without expecting anything in return. That describes service to me. Any member who steps into service offers their experience, strength, hope, skills, time and willingness to give back to the Group, District, Area or World Service Office. This is given freely with no expectation of reward. But here's the funny thing – we do receive rewards many of which I have shared in responding to Question 2.

The ideas for these questions were taken from "How Al-Anon Works for Family and Friends of Alcoholics (hard cover) page 101, Chapter 14, "Service". One might say that this Chapter is a "Service 101" course.

Ask it Basket!

Question: When some members are reading the Legacies aloud at meetings, they change the wording to suit their comfort level. Even though Tradition Four states that "each group should be autonomous, except in matters affecting another group or Al-Anon or AA as a whole", changing the wording of our Legacies does affect Al-Anon as a whole. Can you provide some clarification?

Answer:

Many members have asked if the Legacies can be changed and it has been discussed by members of the World Service Conference. The consensus of the World Service Conference has been to confirm the Twelve Steps and Twelve Traditions as they appear in the literature when reading aloud or in written communication.

Changing the Steps when reading them aloud would violate Al-Anon's principles. Our Al-Anon World Service Conference Charter states: "...No changes are to be made in the Al-Anon or Alateen Traditions, the Steps, the Concepts of Service (except the descriptive text) or General Warranties of the Conference Charter (Item 12) without written consent of three quarters of the Al-Anon Family Groups." (2018-2021 Al-Anon/Alateen Service Manual, pg. 226)

While members are free to interpret the Steps and Traditions according to their own perceptions, Al-Anon's unity is preserved when they are read aloud as written. The consistent use of CAL and reading our Publications as they are written assures Al-Anon members that wherever they go throughout the world, Al-Anon's message of help and hope will remain clear and consistent.
