You are a special family in my life, my Al-Anon family walks with me daily and the fellowship is vital to my well being; *"you understand as perhaps few others can".* 

Secondly, I'd like to welcome the new Officers Audrey - Treasurer, Deborah - Secretary, as well as the Public Outreach Coordinator Nellie.

Thank you to Janis our outgoing Treasurer for all your wisdom, insight, and support as well as to Shannon for stepping up as intern Secretary and being so accommodating and attentive and always an e-mail away for support. You truly bless the fellowship with your passion and willingness to serve.

Also, a big thank you to Gail as outgoing Public Outreach Coordinator and the great job you have done on building the Public Outreach Coordinator committee that meets regularly to reach out for Al-Anon.

Ermagarde has reflected over the last few weeks of the ending year; and has come up with some ideas about how to participate in refreshing and encouraging one another in Al-Anon, in her District and Groups.

Her "TO DO" list looks like this:

- Connect with my Alternate at least once a week and forward her all the email communications from District and Area. This is my last year of the service term, and it is responsible to have other members aware and up to speed on the recent activities and current information for rotation of service.
- Reach out to Groups and ensure they have reviewed and updated their meeting information times, locations etc. to ensure newcomers can find Al-Anon easily. As well, encourage groups to have purchased the *K-10 Welcome Newcomer kit* to have ready on hand to give out to newcomers. The New Year "Tis the Season" for people affected by someone else's drinking to seek out Al-Anon. Al-Anon Family Groups want to be there and ready "when anyone anywhere reaches out."
- Helping Districts and Groups support the Public Outreach of informing and attracting newcomers with Al-Anon Faces Alcoholism. This is a magazine the same size as the Forum published yearly by the World Service Office. Groups, Districts, or individuals can order a yearly supply of copies to hand out to newcomers or leave in the community for potential newcomers. The purpose of Al-Anon Faces Alcoholism is to address the newcomer who must overcome multiple challenges such as denial, shame, embarrassment revealing the family circumstances, and believing no one could understand what they were going thru etc.

Al-Anon Faces Alcoholism is designed to address those challenges as members share how they overcame the fear of reaching out and most of all share hope, understanding and compassion with the potential newcomer.

Encourage individual members and groups to subscribe to the Forum magazine. The Forum Magazine is Al-Anon's monthly magazine published by World Service Office, where members share how the various tools of the program including the Twelve Steps, Traditions, and Concepts of service have helped them find-- and keep recovery. Groups and individual members of Al-Anon can buy a subscription and it is mailed monthly. The purchasing of a subscription also supports the operation of our World Service Office as two thirds of the operating expenses are covered by literature sales which includes the Forum. As of September 2023, the BC/Yukon Area had approximately 173 registered Al-Anon/Alateen groups.

As of December 2023, we have 30 groups in BC subscribing and 1 group in the Yukon. Also 113 individual subscriptions, the total number of subscriptions of groups and individual members together has gone down by 10 subscriptions since 2022.

Ermagarde is going to encourage Group Representatives to reach out to their groups and encourage groups and members to participate in supporting the Forum by not only subscribing but considering writing a submission to the Forum.

- With that in mind, Ermagarde feels empowered to encourage the members in the District and Groups in her Area to share *Al-Anon Faces Alcoholism* with the potential newcomers in the community and share *The Forum* with one another.
- Finally, Ermagarde would like to reach out to the Districts and Groups to consider doing District/Group Inventories to see what's working and what might be a struggle affecting the District or Groups. The Guidelines *Taking a Group Inventory G-8a* and *Taking a Group Inventory G-8b Methods and Reflections*, contain *informative* resources in the process.

The New Year is a great time to do exercises that promote group harmony and healthy group growth.

As Area Forum Coordinator I'd like to share from our three legacies contained in the January 2019 issue of *The Forum*:

**Step One:** I heard someone read about step one being powerless—what? That one sentence was about to change my whole life. I had taken my first steps walking thru the door, I became ready to acknowledge how unmanageable my life had become trying to do it my way.

**Tradition One:** In Al-Anon I must do the work that is mine to do. To gain success in Al-Anon I must use my Al-Anon tools —like reading Conference Approved Literature (CAL), listening in meetings for wisdom, strength, and hope, based on what I learn I must try to change my own life. I can't

expect others to fix my problems for me, as I did in every relationship before AI-Anon. I have the opportunity to learn when I listen, as well as an opportunity to give the gift of truly being heard to another person.

**Concept One:** Letting my part be enough. Concept One reminds me reaching out to Al-Anon means utilizing the tools, one of which is keeping the focus off the alcoholic, and in turn to learn to focus on myself. Ultimately learning to relinquish misunderstood responsibility means shifting the focus to my Higher Power's will not mine. Practicing this new responsibility has brought me freedom from a heavy burden.

## Financial Matters for BC/Yukon Area Groups

*Tradition Seven: Every group ought to be fully self-supporting, declining outside contributions.* Please refer to pages 52 to 57 in "Groups at Work 2022-2025" or "Service Manual" for a complete explanation of this tradition as it relates to member contributions. <u>https://al-anon.org/for-members/members-resources/manuals-and-guidelines/</u>

#### **Distributing Group Funds:**

**Your Group Meeting:** Rent or electronic meeting platform fee, insurance (if required), literature, Group Representative expenses to attend Assembly in September, local public outreach, Forum subscription, reserve fund (suggest 3 months expenses) and other meeting expenses as per group conscience.

**Your District**: Rent or electronic meeting platform fee, District Representative's expenses to attend AWSCM, local public outreach projects, workshops, Alateen support (if needed), Beginners meetings (if needed), local answering services and other district expenses as required. (see pp 158-159 in *Service Manual*).

Al-Anon Information Service Offices: Rent for office and overhead expenses (may include part time employee wages, insurance, telephone, office equipment). The AIS offices also offer Al-Anon literature for sale. (see pp 65-67 *Service Manual*) Victoria and Vancouver AIS offices accept electronic contributions. BC/Yukon Area: Assembly and AWSCM expenses, Delegate travel expenses to attend the World Service Conference, expenses related to Officer's & Coordinator's duties, website costs. (see pp 67 Service Manual)

In a motion passed at Assembly 2007, members suggested a goal of 50 cents per person per meeting be contributed to the Area - or choose any amount as per group conscience.
