

Alternate Delegate's Report



Hello fellow Al-Anon/Alateen members:

As I prepare this interim report the sun is shining, Spring is arriving, and it is a time of new beginnings which is fitting in our Area currently. The WSC theme this year for Al-Anon is "Our path towards Grace, Unity, and Understanding."

We have used this theme frequently as of late in our Area to keep serving and focusing on our primary spiritual aim. I have relied heavily on God... my Higher Power to provide me with the confidence that he is in control. God has provided me with grace, unity and understanding as we move forward in filling and supporting vacant service positions at the Area level. To attend to unexpected circumstances, the Officers and Coordinators have pulled together in unity with understanding and grace towards Area finances, and service members' personal circumstances. We have met frequently and worked in unity with the guidance of our Traditions to make decisions for the business of Al-Anon and the fellowship.

Service Positions and Job Descriptions

My work this past year has allowed me to continue coordinating the updating of the Officers and Coordinators job descriptions, in order that you as a member, are aware of the full scope of what it means to take on a service position at the Area level. Many positions have evolved and adapted, some would say thanks to technology, which provides opportunities for us to serve and do the business of Al-Anon by meeting electronically when we would not be able to meet otherwise. As well, when any fellowship grows the way we do, things change. It is important to have the Job descriptions reflect accurately what skills and duties a job entails. Updated, accurate Job Descriptions are an important reference point for our GRs as trusted servants as they elect Officers at Assembly. In preparation to elect a suitable candidate for a Position at Assembly, the GRs are asked to review the job description, then look at the candidates resume and compare the skills and experience needed with the skills and experience of the candidate to ensure they are a match, and to ensure the individual has a good working knowledge of the Traditions and Concepts in service.

This is how Knowledge Based Decision Making is used, and it helps us to keep principles above personalities. As our co-founder Lois W said, we must remember to choose the best person possible to do the job for Al-Anon even if it's not our friends.

District Representatives' Orientation

I am busy in thought and work reorganizing the DR Orientation. Another example of our theme in action, now that we are meeting by zoom only, it is with that understanding that I adapt it to an online event and shorten it. It is Ermagarde's last year as a DR, so she is focusing on the task of rotation of service with a thorough handover. I hope you can join us on Zoom for AWSCM and see Ermagarde's' plan.

Supportive Area Service

As Alternate Delegate, I keep up to date on supporting our Delegate in his role of carrying the Area envelope to the WSC in April. As well, I participate in supporting the other tasks and needs as they arise.

Recently, I reviewed the lists of motions with the Past Delegate and Past Chair/interim Secretary.

I had read the motions and referred to various motions in my service roles, but reviewing every motion to see how our practices reflect our motions was insightful. The members' voice, goals and growth for Al-Anon in our Area is fully recorded in many motions. Just like our Traditions, the motions were sound and wise and reflect our needs. I learned a lot about applying the group conscience of the members in guiding the decisions we make, and about the history of our Area fellowship and how we have evolved.

The motions are the guiding light, the compass if you will, and very a valuable resource for the Officers and Coordinators, as we take responsibility to make decisions about Area operations and functions in between AWSCM and Assembly.

I am passionate about applying Tradition Two in our fellowship and feel it is a privilege to Serve, Learn and Grow in Unity as I serve the BC/Yukon Area as Alternate Delegate.

I get life learning experiences God designed me to get right here, serving, that I could not have experienced elsewhere.

Treasurer's Report

Dear Al-Anon Members and Friends:

On behalf of your Officers and Coordinators, I'd like to send a very big THANK YOU for your contributions since our letter of appeal was sent early in March of this year. Your response was immediate and significant, totaling \$7,596.71 and counting!

As of 24 March 2024, our operating account bank balance was \$19,214.09. This appears to be a very healthy amount. However, when your Officers and Coordinators reviewed the costs of traveling to Prince George for our AWSCM this year (estimated at ~\$13,500), the need for operating funds to pay for Assembly in September, general escalating costs, and the limited time to organize this event, we were faced with a difficult decision. When reviewing the hard numbers, we unanimously agreed to act responsibly with your contributed funds, and hold AWSCM online this year.

We are confident we will host AWSCM in person in 2025 and urge you to consider becoming the host district. We truly believe in-person meetings enrich our fellowship, and we'll welcome your guidance on this topic at Assembly this year.

In accordance with a Motion passed in 2022, we are currently building a Finance Committee. "Move that the BC/Yukon Area selects a Finance Committee (up to five members) to provide oversight and support to the Treasurer, review mid-term and year-end reports, and develop a budget to be presented at Assembly, ending the three-year trial. Committee members will have Al-Anon service experience as well as knowledge of basic bookkeeping practices."

I have much to learn in my new role as Treasurer, and I am grateful to everyone for your patience as I learn and grow. If you have any questions or concerns, please do not hesitate to contact me. One small request: if sending Tradition 7 contributions via Interac e-transfer, please remember to mention the name and location of your meeting.

I'm thankful that the Area Officers and Coordinators meeting was available online and I participated with a focus on listening and learning.

I've had monthly Public Outreach Committee (POC) meetings with DR's and AFG members, and it's been great to get inspiration for public outreach initiatives and to throw around ideas. POC members have been super helpful in designing a 2024 Al-Anon meeting poster for local communi-

I'm on the lookout for Fraser Valley (FV) AFG members who are willing to get involved in Corrections Connections as there will be a fall information fair inside the Correctional Service Institutions and a planning committee for the 2025 FV AA Corrections Roundup. It's evident that there are opportunities to reach family members of incarcerated people, letting them know that there is help and hope in their local communities. The March 16th Corrections Roundup "Inches and Seconds" had a full house. There were more than 230 participants, three well attended Al-Anon meetings during the day and Gail S. was very well-received as the Al-Anon Speaker. The event exceeded expectations.


